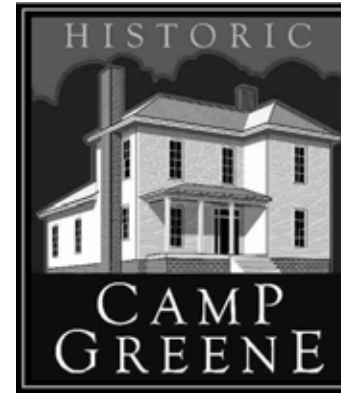

### Park and Recreation Updates

A big thanks to Park Planner Brian Conroy for informing us all about the new parks and greenways coming to our area.

Revolution Regional Recreation Center will begin reconstruction soon and this \$10 million facility should be open Summer 2009. Revolution is being designed as a "sports center" with a focus on golf, football, boxing, and wrestling. There will also be a 200-meter running track and a targeted fitness center. This center is designed to compliment and not duplicate the efforts of the other two athletic recreation centers in our area, Arbor Glen and Southview.

Also look for the section of the Greenway behind Lela Court in Wesley Heights to be completed this summer.

- ❖ Work on the Charlotte Law School continues. The building is framed and topped out. Completion expected August 2008.
- ❖ Code Enforcement officers are continuing their efforts to rid our community of substandard housing.
- ❖ Community Improvement, Phase III, beginning May/June 2008
  - Arty Ave – 6” water main Berryhill to Morehead
  - Greenland – 6” water main Berryhill to Monument
  - Monument – 6” water main Wilkinson to Greenland
  - Morton – 6” water main Remount to Berryhill
  - Remount – 6” water main Morton to Morton
  - Marlowe – sidewalk, curb & gutter, sidewalk improvements
  - Monument – valley gutter Wilkinson to Morton
  - Morton – sidewalk Remount East to Berryhill
  - Remount – sidewalk 2115 Remount to Morton East, sidewalk improvements, valley gutter
  - Greenland scheduled for repaving Spring 2009

  - Fatal shooting on Weyland Avenue. No suspects at present.
  - Break-ins on Garibaldi. Make sure you keep your home secure and watch out for your neighbors
